The Data shows...

- A significant decrease in the amount of instructional time students miss as a result of discipline placement.
- Campus efforts to improve school climate and culture with regard to student self discipline data is improving.
- Each campus is addressing concerns with student behavior in ways other than suspension, ISS, or DAEP.
- Student performance on state assessments has continues to improve; Student time on task has increased at the same time.

District Solutions...

- Each campus is exploring options other than "out of instruction" discipline consequences.
 - For example, extended school in the afternoon, Saturday school, etc.
- Each campus is examining how ISS is staffed to include core content teachers to assist students in their academic development.
- Study the effects of discipline placements on state assessments, graduation/completion rates, attendance, and teacher effectiveness.
