Hiteon is a community dedicated to providing an educational experience in which everyone can reach their full potential and make positive societal contributions. We strive to enhance personal, community, and global identities while developing life-long learners.

### Overview

In recent years Hiteon has seen an increase in student mobility and a shift in demographics. Hiteon is ranked Level Four on the 2015-2016 Oregon Department of Education School Report Card. Thus, it appears Hiteon is a high performing school. Upon deeper inspection, individual student populations show significant underachievement. Our subgroups are demonstrating less than 50 percent proficiency in English Language Arts and Mathematics (Economically Disadvantaged, English Learners, Students with Disabilities, Hispanic/Latino). These subgroups demand Hiteon's attention.

For the 2016-2017 school year we are focused on increasing student achievement for our English Language Learners, Hispanic/Latino, and Economically Disadvantaged students. I've created a 2016-2017 Plan for Advancement with the support of my staff. I am focusing the school to improve these underperforming subgroups and will raise Hiteon's overall achievement level to equitably serve our students over the next few years.

74.4% of Hiteon's Hispanic/Latino students ARE NOT proficient in ELA as measured by SBAC.

76.9% of Hiteon's Hispanic/Latino students ARE NOT proficient in Math as measured by SBAC.

58.1% of Hiteon's Economically Disadvantaged students ARE NOT proficient in ELA as measured by SBAC.

60.0% of Hiteon's Economically Disadvantaged students ARE NOT proficient in Math as measured by SBAC.


- Vision Work: Formation of Pedagogical Leadership Team

## Hiteon at a Glance 2015-2016 School Report Card


Student population hovers around 700 for the last 3 years, although the mix of students shifts year to year.
