been selected for eligibility based on 2007 and 2008 results for grade 3 TAKS reading. TEA has selected Prada Elementary as an eligible campus to apply for a maximum \$100,000 grant. The purpose of the grant is to provide supplemental, intensive intervention in reading or language acquisition during the school day using neuroscience based, scientifically validated interventions or instructional tools proven to accelerate learning, cognitive ability, and English language proficiency.
