Migrant Summer School

Again this year Homedale and Marsing School Districts have combined dollars to run a Migrant Summer School. Homedale has been provided additional Migrant funds to accommodate the Marsing students. We are serving migrant students 3 years of age through 6th grade. We have partnered with the University of Idaho Extension office and 4-H to provide our students with robotics and hands on nutrition classes 3 days a week. Other enrichment opportunities include Library, Recreation, and Culture classes. The students will be visiting Babby Farms, Birds of Prey, and the preschool students will also be visiting the firehouse. Between the two districts we are servicing 78 Migrant students.
