Teaching, Learning & Relevance

- The PreACT was administered on April 17th and the Forward Exam took place over the course of two days, April 18th and 19th. There was extensive training and preparation that took place in order to run a successful assessment environment. Test administration ran smoothly and observations were noted for next year. Thank you to all staff who helped in creating a positive testing environment.
- Juniors attended an information session on the college admissions process on May 1st. Mai Yia from UW Help presented to the class on a variety of topics within the application process. She shared resources and ideas for students to consider when applying to colleges.
- On May 2nd, THS 9th graders attended a Career Fair at Rhinelander High School. Students were able to meet representatives from 58 businesses and organizations. THS and RHI counselors coordinated to provide topics for students to discuss with employers to learn more about career fields. This event was developed through community partnerships to support students in their ACP processes and generate excitement about career opportunities in our area.
- Advanced Placement and Project Lead The Way courses will be conducting their end-of-course exams throughout the month of May. Student achievement on these exams will determine eligibility for college credit attainment.
- Our High School Community Partnership Highlight for May is Louisiana Pacific. Roxan Reas and Dave Thomas from LP presented to the high school teaching staff about the

company and various position types at LP. They focused on high-demand employee attributes and how employees with these skills have great opportunities within LP's organizational structure.
