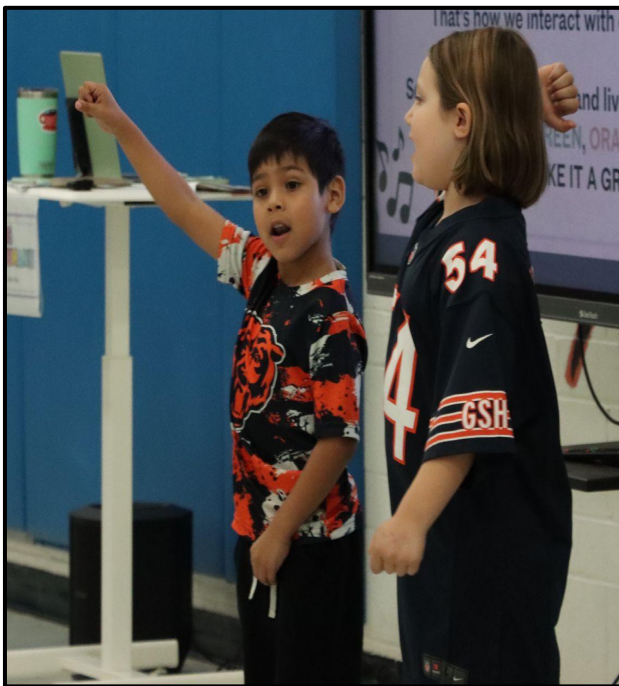

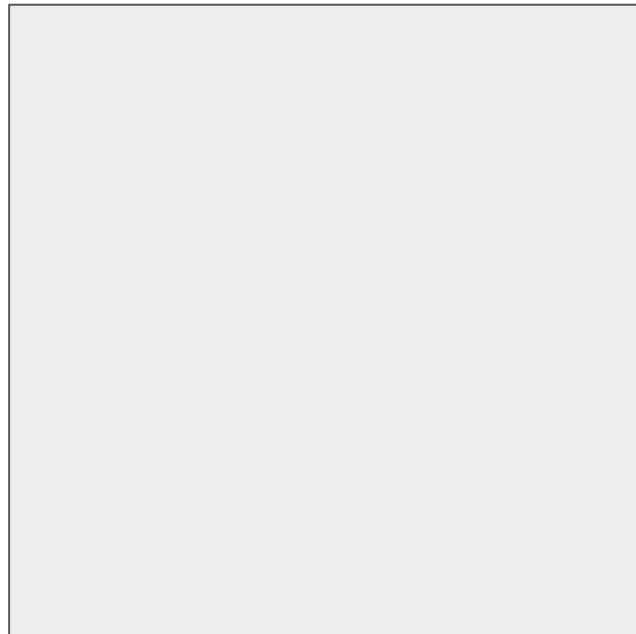
Improvement

This month, we made progress in:

Culture: 3rd–5th grade students completed a baseline 5Essentials Pulse survey on Ambitious Instruction. The results will guide next steps and inform student focus groups. The Building Leadership Team (BLT) will create monthly 5Essentials discussion sessions and presentations for students.

Literacy: CHAMPS has been fully implemented in all classrooms. Many classrooms now have students facilitate CHAMPS expectations for the class.

Math: To support our focus of Facilitating Mathematical Discourse. During our November SIP Day, staff had the opportunity to develop a plan for implementing accountable talk. Teachers then shared strategies and successes during PLCs. Next steps include opportunities for staff to visit one another to see accountable talk in action!
