Articulation Agreement and Contract for Instruction for the Dual-Credit Diesel Academy between The Ector County Independent School District and Odessa College

The purpose of the Odessa College Dual-Credit Diesel Academy (hereinafter called "Program") is to provide a curriculum at Odessa College for Diesel technology students beginning in their Junior year in high school and continuing through their Senior year.

The following articulation agreement and contract for instruction between the Ector County Independent School District (hereinafter called "ISD") and Odessa College (hereinafter called "College") will award Program students up to four (4) high school credits and up to twenty (20) college semester credit hours in the program. Students may also have the opportunity to sit for and pass related Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) certification exams. Program students may, at their option, continue on with advanced academic and workplace courses at Odessa College to attain the Associate's in Applied Science Degree in Industrial Engines and Transportation Maintenance.

To provide a smooth transition for Program students from the high school campus sites to the College, and to eliminate duplication of coursework, the ISD and College agree as follows:

The ISD agrees to:

- 1. Provide and maintain all Junior and Senior level courses on the ECISD Dual Credit inventory listed as "High School Credit for College Courses." These courses and credits awarded are:
 - a. 13040400, Practicum in Diesel Technology I (2 Credits), and
 - b. 13040410, Advanced Flexible Manufacturing (2 Credits).
- 2. Furnish the College with official copies of the following for each Program student:
 - a. High School transcript and
 - b. Properly executed Dual Credit Form.
- 3. Provide payments to the College as listed in Appendix A for all Junior and Senior students for:
 - a. Students' expenses incurred for all supplies, equipment, and textbooks;
 - b. All tuition and fees (less the payments required from the students) for:
 - i. DEMR 1401 Shop Safety and Procedures
 - ii. DEMR 1405 Basic Electrical Systems
 - iii. DEMR 1229 Preventive Maintenance
 - iv. DEMR 2331 Advanced Brake Systems
 - v. DEMR 1230 Steering and Suspension
 - vi. DEMR 1240 Steering and Suspension
 - vii. DEMR 1323 Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning Trouble Shooting and Repair
 - c. Expenses for certification exams.
- 4. Provide transportation to and from the College for all Program students.

The College agrees to:

- 1. Provide a college instructor for all Program students.
- 2. Provide all instructional facilities, instructional materials, and equipment.
- 3. Provide instruction in:
 - a. DEMR 1401 Shop Safety and Procedures
 - b. DEMR 1405 Basic Electrical Systems
 - c. DEMR 1229 Preventive Maintenance
 - d. DEMR 2331 Advanced Brake Systems
 - e. DEMR 1230 Steering and Suspension
 - f. DEMR 1240 Steering and Suspension
 - g. DEMR 1323 Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning Trouble Shooting and Repair
- 4. Grant credit for:
 - a. DEMR 1401, DEMR 1405, and DEMR 1229 for successful completion of the first year in the program.
 - b. DEMR 1230, DEMR 1240, DEMR 1323, and DEMR 2331 for successful completion of the second year.
- 5. Provide the ISD with an accurate attendance report for Program students.

The ISD and College agree to:

- 1. Require each program student to remit \$150 per semester to the college to be applied to tuition and/or fees.
- 2. Promote the program as appropriate.
- 3. Annually review, revise and adopt Appendix A on or before May 1st of each year. Appendix A shall list and define the Program costs per student by semester and shall be effective for the academic year described therein.

This agreement shall become effective when signed by appropriate representatives of the ISD and College, and shall remain in effect, on a year by year basis, until its termination. This agreement may be terminated at the end of any academic year by either party by giving at least a one semester notice to the other party.

- 4. Test fees are for the Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) certification exams. Also includes semi-annual progress exams that are recommended by the advisory board to monitor progress of Program students. These charges represent the actual costs for the examinations.
- 5. Textbook charges are the cost of maintaining the diesel textbook library for the Program students' use.
- 6. Any other costs are the responsibility of the student.
