Discussion of Lone Star TIA

Dwight Goodwin provided the Board with an update regarding TIA 2015 (Technology In Action) conference hosted by Denton ISD on July 21<sup>rd</sup> and 22<sup>th</sup>. TIA had over 1300 attendees with 79 districts from all over Texas. Denton ISD staff, community members and out-of-district educators with quality professional development that focuses on integrating technology into the learning environment so that our students are ready for 21<sup>st</sup> century success. TIA is currently a self-funded event (via participant registration, vendor sponsorships, and donations).

Denton ISD Quarterly Growth Report 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2015 Trustees with information concerning the general DFW housing market, economic indicators, Denton I.S.D. residential activity and enrollment projections as of the 1st Quarter 2015 and its impact to the overall growth of Denton ISD.

Paloma Creek, Providence and Cross Oaks elementary zones have the most home activity, representing 47.4% of the total starts for the district. Denton ISD can expect an increase of approximately 3,900 students during the next 5 years with an enrollment projection of 30,956 students by 2019-2020.

Mr. Gardner reviewed a long-term look at the district over the 25 years.

During the 2014-15 school year, the nutrition team served 3.1 million meals to students which translates to 734,321 breakfasts, 2.2 million lunches and 130.144 snacks.

David McCullar, Director of Fine Arts, presented a review of fine arts programs across the district. He shared that 12,875 elementary and 12,160 secondary (93.7 percent) students participate in one or more fine arts classes. That's a district average of 96.8 percent of our student population.

Athletics Annual Report

Mr. Joey Florence, Athletic Director, reported on the status of athletic programs and teams across the district. He pointed out that the district offers 18 high school and 8 middle school sports for boys and girls and that for the 2014-15 school year, 4,654 students in secondary schools participated in the program – 150 more students than the prior year. The department recognized 485 varsity scholar athletes for outstanding achievement, meaning they maintained a 3.5 GPA and participated in at least one sport.
