6. Public Budget Hearing

6.1 Introductory Comments

President Burns explained Wisconsin law requires all public school districts to hold an annual budget hearing. The annual budget hearing offers the public a chance to review and provide input on the proposed budget for the current (2025–26) school year. The Board will take action on the final 2025-26 budget on October 27, 2025.

6.2 2025-26 Budget Presentation & Annual Report on OPEB Trust

Assistant Superintendent Aaron Norris presented the 2025-26 budget and annual report on the OPEB (Other Post-Employment Benefits) trust, which included the budget adoption timeline, revisions from the preliminary budget, 2025-27 State biennial Budget, and how the budget is developed (revenue limit computation, tax levy computation, total tax levy computation, and mill rate computation).

Mr. Norris reviewed equalization aid and tax levy trends and mill rate trends. Additionally, Mr. Norris detailed Funds 10 (general), 21 (special revenue trust), 27 (special education), 38 (non-referendum debt service), 39 (referendum debt service), 46 (long-term capital improvement trust), 49 (capital projects - referendum), 50 (food service), 73 (employee benefit trust), 80 (community service), as well as Transfer of Service (TOS). Lastly, Mr. Norris reviewed and discussed the projected tax levy for 2025-26, areas of continued budget consideration, and gave a report on energy efficiency measures.
