Science- Penny Wimbrough

Chemistry:

In Chemistry we just finished up a unit on the periodic table. Student learned about the periodic trends and how there are patterns all across the periodic table. We are not beginning our next unit on bonding were students will learn about different types of bonds and the properties the compounds have because of those bonds. AP chemistry is focusing on chemical reactions at this time and writing all types of net ionic and redox reactions.

Biology:

We are working on Carbon Compounds and Biochemistry. They have identified the properties of various macromolecules. They are just beginning an activity where they are building paper models of carbohydrates, lipids and proteins. Then they will be investigating the effects of the saliva enzyme amylase on starch.

Pre-AP Biology:

They are well into their Unit on biochemistry. They began the unit by looking at the macromolecules that are found in various foods and comparing the calories and carbohydrate and lipid content of those foods. They have just completed a laboratory activity where they used a starch plate to investigate the effects of the amylase enzyme on the starch.

Anatomy & Physiology

Fifth period just completed their field trip to UT Southwestern Medical Center. They toured the emergency room at the children's hospital, visited the gross anatomy lab and got to handle human organs (heart, brain liver, kidneys and others) were able to visit with a post doctorate researcher who is studying the effects of hypertension. They are concluding their Integumentary system unit with a debate about skin cancer.

We are currently working our way through a series of kinematic equation problems. This involves a lot of math including geometry, algebra, and trig. We are also coming to terms with the idea that horizontally projected objects fall at the same rate as ones dropped straight. We recreated this with nerf guns after the students calculated the time the dart would take to fall. They also calculated the initial velocity of a toy 'popper' just as it begin to rise into the air

The system instantly grades student responses and can break down performance based on questions and objectives. This gives the teacher additional time to re-teach and review on only the most necessary of material. The teacher can also control the computer from anywhere in the room which helps with monitoring student work and classroom management. So far, the students are very eager to use the system and love that they can see their grades immediately upon completing their work.
