March has started, kicking off field trips and the knowledge that spring is quickly approaching. Here are a few moments from a kindergarten field trip to the Vault Gym in Perham.








- Discussions around 25-26 Course offerings and opportunities are being completed.

Menahga Principal Goals for 2024-2025

- 1. Support Staff
 - a. As school leaders we will provide clear communication on the happenings of our buildings while maintaining open lines of communication to support staff and their work with students.
 - i. Staff Newsletters are coming, monthly
 - ii. Staff meetings are happening, monthly
 - iii. Committee meetings are happening, monthly
 - iv. ALICE
 - b. Specific, valuable feedback will be provided to staff in an effort to continue ongoing growth for our teachers as instructional leaders.
 - i. Third round of observations for probationary staff are beginning. High School is just behind the Elementary schedule.
 - ii. Tenured teachers have completed the observation cycle.
 - iii. Walk throughs are happening.
 - iv. Literacy coaching in cooperation with the READ Act is underway. This training must be completed by the end of April. Several staff have completed the online portion of training, with live sessions concluding on our April professional development day.
- 2. Facilitate Strong Student Achievement
 - a. We will collaborate with all staff to provide purpose and professional development around assessments and using data to drive instruction.

- i. Paraprofessional training requirements were met and January training took place and on January 20th around visuals, sensory rooms, CATALYST and CPI (Crisis Prevention Institute).
- ii. Sourcewell led STEM discussions and offerings to support curriculum and standards development
- iii. Local Literacy Leads, Andria Bristow and Lisa Parrish continue to attend Sourcewell monthly for additional planning around Minnesota's Literacy changes.
- iv. Sourcewell provided training and support with AI and the impact it has on teachers, differentiation and student support.
- v. Several teams have taken part in attending conferences, and will bring back new information to their department and the district (Music, Social Workers, Special Education, Social Studies).
- vi. MCA Training for staff and preparation for the assessment is taking place and being communicated throughout the district.
