Prudential Spirit of Community Award Top Middle Level youth volunteer - Cody Grater

Cody Grater, an 8th grader at Meadow Park Middle School has been selected as one of two of Oregon's top Middle Level youth volunteers in the 2013 Prudential Spirit of Community Awards, a nationwide program honoring young people for outstanding acts of volunteerism. As a State Honoree, Cody will receive a \$1,000 award, an engraved silver medallion and an all-expense-paid trip to Washington D.C., for a series of national events this May.

Cody helped his former music teacher clean and organize her classroom every summer since he was in the fifth grade, and last year helped her move to a new school and paint the walls of her room a bright and cheerful color for the incoming students. Cody says he helped his former teacher because she inspired him to keep making music. Cody assisted with the transition in the new music room by moving instruments, cleaning out items, and painting. The best part of helping his teacher, Cody said, was "imagining the kids that were going to walk in the first day of school and see their dusty music room transformed to a place where they can smile and grow." Cody has also helped collect clothing for orphans during the holidays, and worked with an elementary school chess club for one hour a week during the school year. Based on his number of volunteer hours, Cody has also qualified for the President's Volunteer Service Award, which recognizes Americans of all ages who have volunteered significant amounts of their time to serve their local communities.
