Support all students to feel safe, physically, socially, emotionally and academically.

• Address student's needs in a holistic way, taking into account their relationships, self-regulation,

academic competence and physical and emotional well-being.

• Explicitly connect students to the school community and provide them with opportunities to

practice and strengthen their academic, social and emotional skills.

• Supports staff's capacity to work together as a team with a shared sense of responsibility for

every student.

Helps the school anticipate and adapt to the ever-changing needs of students and the

community.

• Based on principles of equity, respect and transparency.

• Supports students' access to school and community resources that helps students participate

fully in the school community and helps adults create a whole school environment that engages

all students.

Collaboration with families that actively engages them in all aspects of the education, helps

them feel welcome at school and helps them understand their role in supporting their child's

education.

Students must feel safe and connected to adults everywhere in the building.
