Provide a full range of challenging career and technical education opportunities that engage students and help them make the most of their high school experience. Our programs prepare students for college and careers.





Definitions:

• Comprehensive CTE Program: A traditional CTE program without the benefit of support by a Joint Technical Education District (JTED).

• JTED Program: Any approved CTE program that has demonstrated enhancement to the program through either staffing, industry validated equipment, facility, or curriculum.





Definitions continued:

 Satellite JTED Course: a CTE/JTED course at one of our high schools

 Central JTED Course: a CTE/JTED course offered at one of the Pima County JTED campuses





Definitions continued:

 Concentrator: A student who has 2 or more transcripted Carnegie Units in the state recognized CTE program sequence.

• Placement: A concentrator who is enrolled in postsecondary education, employed in the program area, and/or serving in the military in the fall semester after the student graduated.





Definitions continued:

• **Program sequence**: The program specific courses teaching the state program standards usually beginning with fundamentals and progressing to advanced skills. All courses in the sequence must be offered.

Examples:

Automotive Technology:

Automotive Technology Core Curriculum (Auto Tech I)

Automotive Technology I (Auto Tech II)

Automotive Technology II (Auto Tech III)

Early Childhood:

Fundamentals of Early Childhood Education (Early Childhood I)

Early Childhood Education Applications (Early Childhood II)







The District Must Ensure CTE Programs:

- Deliver a coherent sequence of instruction;
- Teach all Arizona Department of Education (ADE) designated program standards;
- Be specified on the current CTE program list;
- Be taught by an appropriately certified teacher per CTE certification requirements;
- Evaluate program performance annually and meet or exceed established state performance measures (academic integration);
- Offer student work-based participation that involves actual work experience and connects classroom learning to work activities;
- Require a Career Technical Student Organization (CTSO) to be organized for the CTE program area.

2015-16 CTE Program Highlights

Partnership with the Pima County JTED

- ▶ Pima county voters approved the formation of the Pima County JTED (Joint Technical Education District) in 2006 which provided county-wide high school students the following advantages:
 - Expanded opportunities for CTE courses at their home high school
 - Expansion of new programs
 - Enhanced CTE programs at their home high school
 - ▶ For example, the ability to acquire industry validated equipment and to update facilities
 - CTE/JTED program opportunities through the Pima County JTED

In 2015-16, Amphitheater School District had 105 students enrolled in central JTED programs.





CTE Funding is Based on Approved Programs

- Requirements of an approved program:
 - Delivers the state approved coherent sequence of instruction
 - Teaches all ADE designated program standards
 - Taught by CTE certified teacher
 - Evaluates program annually
 - Offers work-based participation
 - CTSO is available to students in the program





CTE Funding

- **Perkins**: Federal money based on poverty level of district and Federal census data. Improving our Performance Measures is critical for the grant to be approved by the Arizona Department of Education.
- **Priority**: State money based on **unduplicated enrollment** and completion of 11 and 12 grade students in CTE courses and placement 6 months after graduation.





JTED Funding

- State money based on taxes and unduplicated enrollment of 10-12 grade in CTE programs.
- Each JTED Satellite student can generate 1.25 Average Daily Membership (ADM).
- The District reports .25 of the ADM of satellite enrollment to the Pima County JTED and then reports 1.0 ADM to the Arizona Department of Education.
- If the JTED Satellite student is not a full time student (4 courses), the JTED will get .25 and the district will only receive .75 instead of 1.0.
 - If any student has 4 or less courses and one is JTED, the district can lose ADM.





JTED Funding To The District

 The District receives an allocation based on our JTED satellite ADM from the Pima County JTED to run our JTED Satellite programs.

• The District also receives a small allocation for each Amphi student enrolled in Central JTED programs.





Additional Requirements of CTE Programs to Receive JTED Funding

- Leads to certification or licensure verified by industry that student would not otherwise be qualified to receive
- 60% assessment pass score on the Technical Skill End of Program Assessment
- Majority of instruction needs to be in a lab, field, work-based instruction
- Defined pathway to career and/or postsecondary education in a specific vocation or industry
- Specialized equipment which exceeds cost of standard course equipment





Other Items the District Must Consider Based on JTED Legislation.

"A school district may not prohibit or discourage students who are enrolled in that school district from attending courses offered by a joint technical education district, including requiring a student to generate a full 1.0 Average Daily Membership or enrolling in more courses than are needed for a particular student to graduate before enrolling and attending programs or courses offered by a joint district."

Senate Bill 1525





Legislation Continued

The Department of Education shall include each joint technical education district in the department's annual achievement profiles. Subject to approval by the State Board of Education, The Department of Education shall develop specific criteria applicable to joint districts and include joint districts in the letter grade classification system. The department shall include all of the following performance indicators in the annual achievement profiles and letter grade classification:

- Graduation rate of all students enrolled in CTE
- The completion rate for each program
- Performance on technical skills assessments
- Post-graduation employment rates for CTE concentrators
