

SDC Report for 1st Quarter 2010-2011 Harlem High School Main Campus

Total Offenses:

- There were 860 disciplinary violations during the 1st quarter. This is a decrease of 56% from last year, partially due to the elimination of the lunch time tutoring (TUT) program, which accounted for 404 of the 1529 violations during the 1st quarter in 2009-2010.
- Of the 1855 students at HHS, there were 348 (221 male & 127 female) students who received one or more disciplinary violations during the 1st quarter; this represents 18.8% of the student population.
- 69 of the students receiving one or more disciplinary violations were freshman; this represents 19.2% of students receiving violations. 103 sophomores received violations, representing 29.6%. 90 juniors received violations, accounting for 25.9%, and 85 seniors received violations, representing 24.4%. One graduated special education student received violations as well.

Race Report:

- Minority students comprise 16.2% (301/1855) of the student body.
- During the 1st quarter 81 of the 348 students receiving one or more disciplinary violations were minority students. This accounts for 26.9% of the minority population.
- Of the 860 total discipline violations written, 247 were written for minority students. This is 28.7% of the violations.

Free and Reduced Report:

- 41.3% (766/1855) of the student population is eligible for free or reduced lunch.
- 469/860 or 54.5% of the disciplinary violations written were written for students who receive free or reduced lunch. These percentages are consistent with 1st and 4th quarter last year.
- 181/348 students receiving free or reduced lunch received one or more violations. This accounts for 52% of the students who received one or more referrals, and is also consistent with 1st and 4th quarter last year.

Special Ed Report:

- There are 272 students at the high school receiving special education services. This is about 14.7% of the population.
- 198 disciplinary violations written were written for special education students. This is 23% of the total violations written. Down 6% from 1st quarter last year.
- 77 special education students received one or more referrals. This is about 28.3% of the total special education population, and represents 22.1% of the total number of students receiving referrals.

Arrest and Referred to Juvenile Report:

- There were 14 incidents that resulted in referral to juvenile authorities and 4 incidents that resulted in arrests during the 1st quarter.
- Of the students who were arrested zero were minority students, but 1 receive free lunch.
- Of the students referred to juvenile authorities 4 were minority students and 5 received free or reduced lunch.
