Re: Eagle Pass Independent School District Eagle Pass High School Track Relocation Project Synthetic Turf Installation Proposal

Dear Mr. Mijares,

We would like to provide the following recommendation for a Change Order that would include synthetic turf and other improvements to the scope of work for the Eagle Pass High School Track Relocation project. Per the terms of procurement, the total change order amount for a project may not exceed 25% of the original contract value or \$1,266,450. The following recommendation will discuss each improvement individually and is summarized on the Job Status Report dated 10/29/24 item PR#1 and the drawing Sheet C02, a summary sketch of the proposed improvements. This recommendation will not include all improvements but remain within the 25% or \$1,266,450.

PR#1 a: 11550 s.f. parking addition \$80,602.00

EPISD requested to double the parking lot size adjacent to the project. The current parking lot has capacity for 41 cars, this proposal would increase the parking lot size to 76 cars. In regard to need, the EP High campus is woefully short in parking, currently having approximately a 460 car capacity. The cost is \$6.98 per s.f. which is reasonable for the required scope of work for this parking lot. However, this item is not recommended due to procurement limitation. This item may be bid separately.

PR#1 b: 360 l.f. of 8' chain link fence w/ 20' gate \$16,000.00

EPISD requested to fence the perimeter of the track area. As a result, 360 linear feet of 8' chain link fence will be needed wrapping around the parking lot and tying into the fence at the day care facility. A 20' swinging vehicle gate will also be included. The proposed cost for this work is \$16,000 and indicates a linear foot cost of \$40.00 with the gate cost of \$1600 which is reasonable for the scope of work.

PR#1 c: Move building 12' Eastward to avoid AEP easement No cost Building location on the plans needed to adjusted to avoid AEP easement. This item is instructional and did not add or deduct any cost from the scope of work.



PR#1 d: Relocate water line 12' Eastward No cost Water line location on the plans needed to adjusted with the building. This item is instructional and did not add or deduct any cost from the scope of work.

PR#1 e: Delete new primary electrical service No cost

It was determined the existing electrical service could stay in place and be utilized to power the new building. This item is instructional and did not add or deduct any cost from the scope of work.

PR#1 f: Run new secondary from existing transformer No cost

It was determined the existing electrical service could stay in place and be utilized to to power the new building. Therefore, a new secondary run will be needed from the existing transformer to the new building. This item is instructional and did not add or deduct any cost from the scope of work.

PR#1 g: Place 2 additional sports lighting poles at track \$3000.00 This item includes adding 2 of the salvaged sports lighting from the softball field to the 4 lights originally shown installed at the track for a total of 6. The work will include installing, wiring, and refocusing 2 additional sports lights. The proposed cost is \$1500 per pole and represents a good value for the scope of work.

PR#1 h: Add Hellas artificial turf in lieu of sod \$1,199,683.00

This item replaces grass practice field with Hellas synthetic turf, "cushdrain" system, and "ecotherm" heat reduction system. This item also includes a synthetic track endzone for high jump and pole vault. It should be noted the contractor agreed to reduced his OH&P to 5% on this item to accommodate EPISD on this large expenditure. The cost is considered a good value for this scope of work in part due to the contactor's generous offer.

PR#1 i: Add 7200 s.f. of synthetic turf to West endzone No Cost This item was included in item PR#1 h.

PR#1 j: Add 280 l.f. of chain link fencing along South property line \$11,200.00 EPISD requested to fence the perimeter of the track area. As a result, 280 linear feet of 8' chain link fence will be needed between the day care fence and the retaining wall fence of the track. The proposed cost for this work is \$11,200 and indicates a linear foot cost of \$40.00 which is reasonable for the scope of work.

PR#1 k: Add 480 l.f. of 8' CL fencing in lieu of 6' at South retaining wall \$6,188.00 The original scope of work included a 6' high fence at the perimeter of the track to serve as fall protection and a security fence. EPISD has requested all fencing be 8'. Therefore, this change addresses that request at the cost \$12.89 per l.f. which is reasonable for the scope of work.



PR#1 I: Add 1180 I.f. of 8' CL fencing in lieu of 6' at perimeter track walk. \$15,212.00 The original scope of work included a 6' high fence at the perimeter walk of the track to serve as a security fence. EPISD has requested all fencing be 8'. Therefore, this change addresses that request at the cost \$12.89 per I.f. which is reasonable for the scope of work.

PR#1 m: Add 2100 s.f. of concrete pavement \$16,800.00

It was noticed there was no vehicular access directly to the track by pavement. Therefore 2100 s.f. of concrete was added to allow vehicles direct access to the track. The cost is \$8.00 per s.f. which is reasonable for concrete pavement for vehicle use. However, this item is not recommended due to procurement limitation. This item may be bid separately.

PR#1 n: Add 750 l.f. of R panel fencing on East property line \$56,250.00 EPISD requested replacing the chain link fence on the East property line with a 12' high visual screen fence. The proposed cost is \$56,250 or \$75 per s.f.. The cost is reasonable for the scope of work.

PR#10: Add 5000 s.f. of sidewalk @ Antonio Garcia per planning department Five months after we had submitted plans for a permit we received comments from the City of EP including the addition of 5000 s.f. of sidewalk along Antonio Garcia. However, this item is not recommended due to procurement limitation. We are recommending bidding this item with the pavement work associated with the additional parking, item PR#1a and pavement Item PR#1m.

In summary, the total cost for recommended items of PR#1 is \$1,307,533.00.

When offset by the \$50,000 betterment allowance, the recommended Change Order will increase the contract amount by \$1,257,533.00. Approval of this Change Order would increase the contract amount to \$6,323,333.00 which is approximately \$9,000 less than 25% of the original contract value. The change order will also extend the completion date 64 days until July 31, 2025.

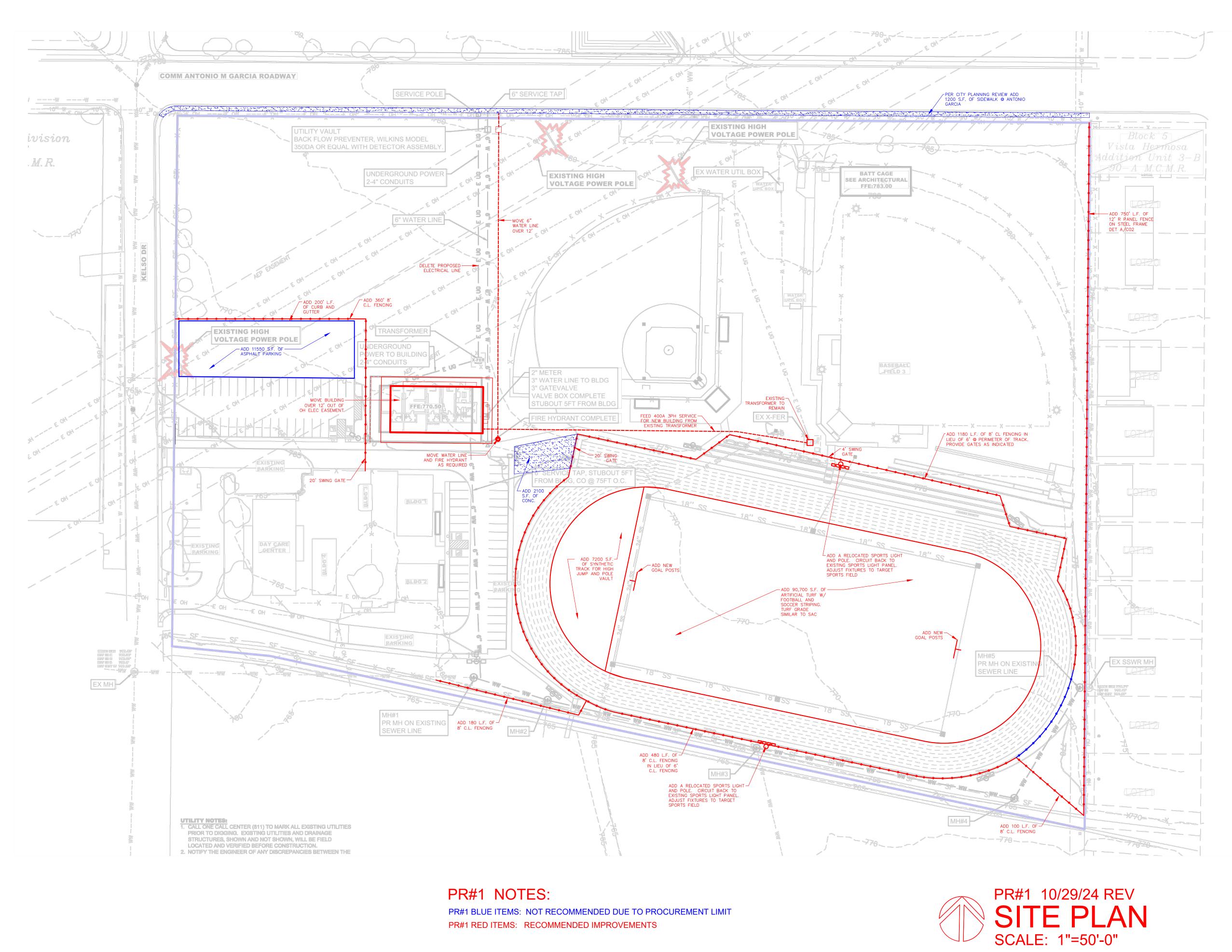

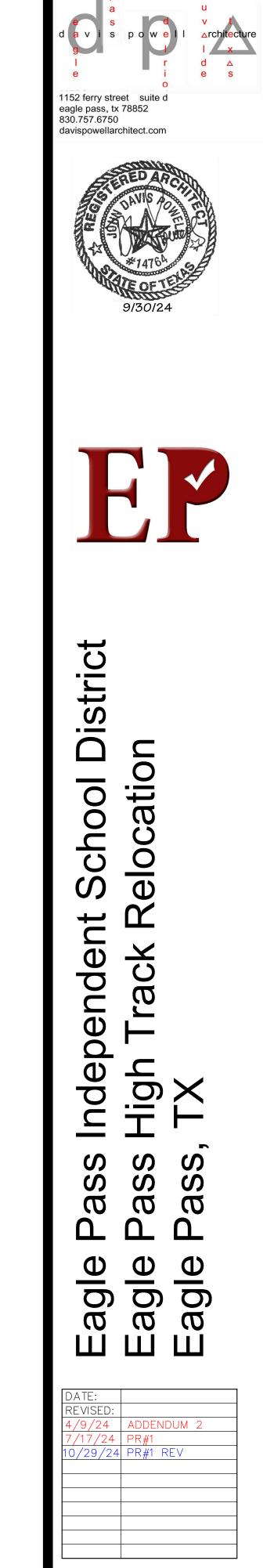
