<b>Kyle Luedtke Superintendent</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• On June 10 I along with athletic director Joe Draxler attended the Luck School District Community Open Forum on Athletics, Co-op Programs and School Engagement. Only one comment was made about academics with the hope to continue to try to offer more. The rest of the evening's conversation centered around athletics and co-operative sports. The majority of those in attendance would like to keep the current situation status quo. There were about 50 people in attendance and it was very civil.</li><li>• Staffing for 2025-26 is a concern. Throughout the Lakeland Conference and region this is a concern. This past month I am learning more and more about the international candidate process. Also have been working on securing the best school psych services with the most efficient use of our funds.</li><li>• On June 12 a group of our staff members reviewed and began revamping our safety plan and procedures. The goal is to share the final plan with the board of education before school resumes.</li><li>• The Joint Finance Committee on June 12 made a Omnibus motion to adopt the state budget. The motion only increases special education from 33% to 35% for the upcoming year and then 37.5% the next year. DPI's budget would be reduced by 10% or \$1.3 million. There is no per pupil increase and Milwaukee Charter School program would receive \$3.9 million the first year and \$8.0 million the second year.</li></ul>

This included staff breaking down their end of unit assessments to identify what standards all students were mastering, as well as what standards students continued to struggle with. Data/findings will be shared out during August inservice so staff can look at our universal instruction to determine areas of weaknesses and strengths, then from there make adjustments to their instruction. This will be work that is continued through next year.</li> <li>● End of year Special Education file reviews have been completed, and the rollover process for next year will be underway in July.</li> <li>● Attended the end of year Special Education Director meeting at CESA.
