

General Information

As a result of WBWF legislation, there is a greater emphasis on college and career readiness

- ACT suite of assessments will be administered to all students*, beginning 2014-2015 (graduation requirement)
 - ACT-Explore: Grade 8
 - ACT-Plan: Grade 10
 - ACT Plus Writing: Grade 11

^{*}All students with the exception of very few students with significant cognitive disabilities. These students take an alternative test (MTAS).

General Information

ACT College and Career Readiness System:

- Provides a longitudinal approach to educational and career planning
- Encourages student academic and behavioral planning through early identification of educational and career goals

ACT Basics

The ACT tests measure achievement in 4 areas:

English College English


Math College Algebra

Reading College Social Science


Science College Biology


ACT Explore Scores (Gr 8)




ACT Explore Results (Gr 8) Percent Meeting CR Benchmarks

ACT Explore and ACT Plan Themes

- As a district, Duluth students exceed the nation on the percent of students meeting college readiness benchmarks in all subject areas
- There is great variation in scores among the schools across the district
- Disparities exist among between ethnic groups

- Very strict guidelines; standardized procedures
 - Examples: seating, timing, start/end times, breaks
 - Alternate plans for students in grades 9, 10, and 12

- District-wide implementation plan
 - Timelines for training, test prep, materials distribution and ordering, etc.
 - Shared with staff, obtained feedback
 - Reviewing monthly as a group
 - Included reps from food service, union leadership, coordinators of special programs, maintenance


- District-wide communication plan
 - Variety of messages shared in waves over the course of the next few months
 - Messages specific to students, parents, staff, community
 - Many communication tools
 - Letters, newsletters, emails, Infinite Campus, Infinite Campus messenger, parent nights, Parent groups, newspaper, class meetings, announcements, WIN time, etc.

- Test Preparation Resources and Opportunities
 - Two types of materials, free and fee
 - Many opportunities for students
 - Achievement Centers, WIN Time, Media Centers, at home


