Response to Instruction and Intervention (RTIi):

Neah-Kah-Nie elementary schools are RTIi schools in the area of reading. An RTIi school has two purposes:

- 1. To identify children needing help in reading and prevent the development of serious learning problems; and
- 2. To identify children who, even when they get extra help, make very limited progress. Research has shown that these children sometimes have learning disabilities.

As a school, we give all of our students K-5 a diagnostic screening test to see how they perform in the area of reading. Teachers look at that data and make decisions based on what the data tells them.
