Lyndon LaPlante makes 99-yard run, winning place in local and national media: Last month, one of our students has received an overwhelming amount of news coverage for a wonderful event that took place in his life.

On Oct. 14, Lyndon LaPlante, son of our own Genni LaPlante, fulfilled his dream by taking a handoff and scampering 99 yards for a touchdown in the Keller High School game versus Richland High. Lyndon, who is a senior with Down syndrome, has been an active member of KISD football teams since he was in middle school. He has always been on the sidelines for the Indians, even dressing out and going through warm-ups with the squad, but this is the first time he ever entered the field of play.

Stories about Lyndon were featured on Channel 5 and Channel 8 and in the *Fort Worth Star-Telegram* and the *Dallas Morning News*, and video of the run has been aired on other news outlets across the nation, including WNBC in New York City – the largest NBC affiliate in the U.S. Lyndon's play was also Dale Hanson's Play of the Week.

Lyndon's story is wonderful and an inspiration to all who hear it. Through e-mail and the media, millions of people are hearing about Lyndon, and phone calls, e-mails and letters are still pouring in, wishing him well. Please join Keller ISD in congratulating Lyndon and the LaPlante family.

Keller ISD Director of Guidance and Counseling receives state-wide award: Keller ISD Director of Guidance and Counseling Janie Casey has been selected by the Texas Counseling Association (TCA) as Counseling Supervisor of the Year for 2005. Janie has worked for 33 years in Keller ISD and has served as director of guidance and counseling since 2000.

Janie was presented with the award at the TCA conference Nov. 3 in El Paso. In the past she has been recognized and received several awards such as Citizen of the Year by the Keller Chamber of Commerce and the Outstanding Alumna Award, given by the University of North Texas, College of Counselor Education. She has also been recognized at the state level by the Texas Senate for community service in 1999.

Janie Faris receives award: Janie Faris, along with her husband, Evan, was recently awarded the Wesleyan Service Award. The award is given to a Texas Wesleyan graduate whose service to the university and the alumni have contributed specifically to the success of the Alumni Association and its programs. Janie served as president of the Texas Wesleyan Alumni Association Board of Directors from 1998-2000 and was asked to serve on the search committees for the University President and the Provost. Most recently, Janie was asked to join the Board of Trustees and began her term this fall. Evan has served on the Texas Wesleyan University Alumni Association Board for the last four years and is the immediate past president.

CHS has National Merit commended students: Central High School Principal David Hinson announced recently that Alyson Williams and Brian Leake have been named Commended Students by the National Merit Scholarship Program. A letter of commendation from the school and the National Merit Scholarship Corporation, which conducts the program, will be presented to these seniors. About 34,000 commended students are being recognized throughout the nation for their academic promise. Although they will not continue in the 2006 competition for Merit Scholarship Awards, commended students represent the top five percent of more than 1 million students who entered the 2006 competition.

Based on further evidence of their academic achievements, a select group of 4,800 students have been recognized by the program as Scholar or Honorable Mention Finalist.

The final three scholars were awarded the high honor of National Scholar. This award is granted to students in the United States who receive an average grade of at least 4 on all AP Exams taken, and grades of 4 or higher on 8 or more of these exams. Gregory Golden, Van Hoang and Xiaochu Song each received this honor.

Bands fare well at contest: Recently, the FRHS band performed at the Duncanville Invitational Marching Contest, a contest that always attracts some of the top bands in the state. The Panther Regiment finished 7th overall out of the competing bands. In its second year as a Varsity Band, the Central Chargers advanced to the Area 'B' Finals competition, placing sixth overall out of 25 bands in the competition. The Charger Band's cumulative score tied them for fifth place. Since the area is only allowed to send five bands to state competition, the decision was made by judge's preference. Two of the five judges ranked Central higher, but the band that tied the Chargers received higher rankings from three judges.

Keller High bands take awards: The Keller High Band recently took part in three marching contests, scoring well in all. On Oct. 1 the band received second place in preliminary rounds and third place in the finals of the HEB Marching Contest. At Bands of America at UT Arlington the KHS Band received second place in its division. And at the UIL Marching Contest on Oct. 25 the band received 1st Division.

KHS sophomore qualifies for Jazz Contest: On Sept. 24 at the Texas Music Educators Jazz Region Contest, Keller High School sophomore Kale Scherler was named 1st chair trombone. This qualifies Kale for area contest where he will compete for a spot in the TMEA All-State Band.

Three student photographers honored: At the Texas Association of Journalism Educators state convention in San Antonio in October, three KISD students were awarded for excellence in photography. Josh Stewart won honorable mention in carry-in newspaper photography; Chelsee Driskill and Addison Wilder won excellence awards in Taste of San Antonio on-site photography competition. This was the first time that Central High students entered the on-site photography contest which gives students three hours and list of categories to shoot. Overall there were 98 digital entries with two CHS winners.

Bear Creek Intermediate PTA earns award: The Bear Creek Intermediate PTA earned the 100% Membership Award from Texas PTA for having 1,104 members join. Enrollment as of Sept. 10 was 1,102. Parents, students, teachers and the community rallied around this year's baseball membership theme "Batter Up...Be a Part of the BCI Team." This is the first time in BCI history that PTA membership has reached over 1,000.

Central High art students receive recognition: Two Central High School art students were recently honored at the First Annual TCU AP art show. More than 25 schools were invited to participate. Lauren Hensarling's piece was chosen to be the advertisement piece for the exhibit and was published in the Star Telegram. Marc Seller won an Honorable Mention. They were honored at a reception in the Moudy Art Building at TCU on Nov. 7. The work will be displayed in the TCU gallery until Nov. 22.

KISD choir students compete in Texas All-State: On Saturday, Oct. 15, 27 KISD choir students competed in the second round of the Texas All-State Choir Competition. A total of 36 singers qualified for round two for each voice part. These auditions narrowed the list to the top 16 students for each part. These singers will compete in the third round of the Texas All-State Choir contest Friday, Nov. 18.

The Central High School Choir Department was well represented when six singers attended the auditions. Three received an audition in the third round and two have been selected as alternates. These students are Rachel Lowrie – 7th chair (Soprano 1), Bruno Li – 9th chair (Tenor 1), John Crawford – 14th chair (Tenor 1), Morgan Tunnell - Alternate (Alto 1), and Jason Schilder - Alternate (Tenor 1).

Four Fossil Ridge High School students competed in the second round of auditions. Two students, Rachel Jacob- 5th chair (Sop 1) and Daniel Hessler- 13th chair (Bass 1), have qualified to participate in round three.

Seventeen Keller High School Choir members competed in the second round. Seven singers successfully won entry into Region V's All-Region Choir.
