Course Summary	Students will learn how to read rhythm and musical notes and play them on an electronic keyboard, which will culminate in the class creating an original piece of music and performing for peers. Musical basics, such as rhythm, beat, pitch, scale, chords, and melody will be taught first through group practice, and then integrated into the keyboard playing.
