- Julie is completing the Alaska Staff Development Course for Elementary Reading Intervention Strategies to improve interventions and instruction.
- Lisa completed the annual STEAM camp and made some connections to collaborate and expand student learning opportunities while also accessing new resources that our students will utilize this year. She completed the Code.org course and made a commitment to incorporate this intrusion across our grade levels.
- We had an excellent summer expanding our garden days and collaborating with the US Forest Service bunkhouse workers. Their efforts lead to some major progress on the completion of many projects.
