ACT, PreACT, Moasic Testing

Mrs. Sinclair-Boggs, BHS Instructional Coach along with GEARUP staff; Mrs. Magee and Ms. Goss began the task of making sure all our 9th and 12th grade were assessed with the Mosaic Assessment. Mosaic measures student social and emotional development and growth with this formative assessment. 10th grade students then took the Pre-ACT test; which a low stakes pre-exam for the ACT test. Our 11th graders were given the ACT test, which is a standardized test used for college admissions. Finally we had 1

student required to take the Multi State Alternate Assessment (MSAA) and that was completed within the timelines for the assessment.

OPI looks at the percentage tested for our school as well as composite scores as an indicator for improvement. We will not know the score results until sometime in June. Our completed assessment rate: ACT=78 student tested 74%, Pre-ACT 80students tested 74% and the MSAA 100%. Mosaic=numbers are not available at this time.

OPI also monitors our AimsWeb testing for ELA and Math will begin next week. This is our final benchmarking period.
