CRES Board Report: May 2017

- 100% of CRES students will demonstrate growth in Reading and Math as measured by the Spring, 2017 STAR Enterprise assessment
- CRES 3rd through 6th graders will score at or above the state average on the 2016
 Minnesota Comprehensive Assessments in math and reading
- CRES students will receive 25% fewer behavior reports for defiance and disrespect in 2016-17 than in 2015-16.
- CRES will increase parent involvement activities related to STEAM from zero in 2015-16 to 7 in 2016-17.
- Our track and field day at CRES is scheduled for Friday, May 26th, with no rain date scheduled.
- Kindergarten graduation will be on Thursday, June 1st, with Mrs. Hawkinson and Mrs. Prybyl's classes at 9:00, and Mrs Stangel and Mrs. Holmivig's classes at 1:30.
- 6th grade graduation will be held on Friday, June 2nd, starting at 8:45 a.m., with a 6th grade carnival celebration to follow.
- As has been the case in years past, I have received many positive reports on the great behavior our students show on field trips. I really appreciate the way they have represented CRES and the C-I school district.
- Kyle Benson was honored as an NJPA Teacher of Excellence at a banquet at Grand View on May 1st. Kyle has been a great addition to the 5th grade team and the CRES family.
- The CRES scheduling committee has finalized a schedule for next year, and we have begun presenting this to the staff. Some features include a 9-day cycle for the specials rotation (PE, Music, Tech & Innovation), 50-minutes specials, 60 minutes of common prep time for grade-level teams each day, and teacher-supervised recess. There have been many positive comments as this has been presented to teachers, and we feel this schedule will help make CRES and even better school for students.
- We are currently on pace to see a 51% decrease in the number of Minor Incident Reports and a 26% decrease in Major Incident Reports earned by CRES students when compared to last year.
