

- ✓ Meats: whole, quartered, or roasts
- ✓ Fish: gutted and gilled, with or without heads
- ✓ Plants: whole, fresh or frozen

Confirmations needed:

- ✓ Animal not diseased
- ✓ Proper preparation steps followed
- ✓ Transfer of possession form completed for donating game meat









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Dietary Specifications

CALORIE LIMITS -LUNCH

Calories for K-8 (700)

Grades 9-12 (850)

CALORIE LIMITS -BREAKFAST

Grades K - 8 (550)

Grades 9-12 (600) SODIUM

LUNCH: Max of about 1/2 tsp.

BREAKFAST: Max of about 1/4 tsp

Example: One pkg of prepared ramen contains 3/4 tsp. salt

WHOLE GRAINS

80 % of the weekly grains must be whole grain-rich

A grain is "whole" when it contains all three parts of the vitamin-rich original kernel: bran, endosperm and germ.

SATURATED FAT

No more than 10% of all calories

If calories=550 then no more than 55 can come from saturated fat. One slice of cheese contains about 45 calories of saturated fat.


