Welcome back!! We hope everyone had a restful and joyous holiday!

I would like to let you all know that with this new year, the staff and I will be focusing on attendance, what I believe is the cornerstone of a good education. Students should not be absent more than five days per year. Simply put, kids cannot learn if they are not here. The research proves this. Please take a look at these statistics:

- A student who is five minutes late to school every day will miss 15 hours of instruction during the school year.
- It may take up to 5 years for a chronically absent kindergarten student to catch up to peers
- If a ninth grader misses only 5 days per semester, their chance of graduating is reduced by 25%

These facts are certainly eye-opening. That is why the staff and I are renewing our resolve to improve attendance here at LBMS. We want your students to succeed, and being at school every day is the beginning of that success. Of course, we realize absences are sometimes necessary, so here are a few tips for when an absence cannot be avoided:

- If your child has a doctors appointment, please request a note from the doctor...this will keep the absence from counting against the student.
- Bereavements and legal proceedings will not count against the student, but please notify us in these cases.
- If the student is going to miss school more than six days, please contact the office to make arrangements regarding your child's classwork.

We here at LBMS look forward to continuing this journey that is the 2018-2019 school year, and I hope you will join me in making regular attendance a priority the rest of the way. As always, I thank you for letting us teach your children, and allowing us to be part of their lives.

#### InTouch

InTouch is used to send out important messages about school closures and school events. When you get an automated call from LBMS using this program, it is important to say "Hello" as this triggers the message to start. If you have voicemail, it will leave a message. Please listen to the message in its entirety, then call the school for any unanswered questions. If you have an email on file with LBMS, we often send emails as well. InTouch is also used for attendance calls. If your student has been marked absent in any class, the system will call you to make you aware of this absence. Please listen to the message in its entirety before calling the school

Recently, we've been experiencing problems with students attending after-school basketball games without a parent or guardian. 
