The Math Diagnostic and Writing Placement tests are college placement examines that are required by community colleges such as CWI, LCSC, NIC and CSI). This test will be proctored at HHS in the computer lab by the library. All juniors who did not or will not be taking the ACT or SAT are required to take the test. Seniors who are planning to attend a community college in the fall and need to test are invited to sign up with Mrs. Flaming. (The tests take approximately 1 ½ hours to complete).




Highlights from Spirit Week March 20th-23rd

03/22 Wednesday: Show School Spirit

On Wednesday the theme was <u>Get Involved Day (Wear Red & White)</u>. This was the day that the 8th graders came to the high school for tours, an extra-curricular fair and an orientation that involved starting their 4 year plans. HHS Sources of Strength Peer Leaders, lead tour groups of 3-5 8th graders and helped with answering questions about high school life. 8th graders were encouraged to get involved by signing up for high school clubs, sports and other positive high school activities. On May 2nd, Sources of Strength Peer Leaders and Mrs. Flaming will be visiting the middle school to wrap up 4 year plans and to help the 8th graders preregister for their freshmen classes.















03/23 Thursday: Positive Friends Stick Together

On Thursday the theme was <u>Duct Tape Day</u>. During advisory the Sources of Strength Peer Advisors did a presentation for each class. They did a campaign asking the question about which of the 8 strengths each student was strongest in. Students were asked to write a short essay about their strength. The essays are posted on the walls surrounding the guidance counselor's office as an encouragement to HHS students.





In the afternoon four busses arrived to take all of the 9th and 10th graders to COSSA for a Showcase & Career Fair. This trip allowed HHS students to learn about COSSA programs such as Auto/Diesel Technology, Welding, Engineering Design, Building Construction, Culinary Arts, Health Professions (CNA & EMT certifications). HHS students are eligible to start these programs their sophomore year. These classes require three periods a day and include a technical math credit. Visit the following link to review

ACT & SAT Tests & Test Prep Workshops for Juniors'

The month of April was an important time of testing for the juniors at HHS. Test results for the Saturday **April 8th** Act Test are now available online. Students seeking to view their result need to log into their ACT account at https://services.actstudent.org/OA HTML/actibeCAcdLogin.jsp Some of the juniors are scheduled to take the June 10th ACT.



As a follow up, HHS students have a second opportunity to take the ACT test next fall. We will be registering seniors to take the October ACT in August/September. Students are encouraged to practice for the ACT by visiting http://march2success.com. Idaho students have free access to the online ACT test prep course and may access that by logging into the ACT account they set up when they registered for the ACT.



Tuesday April 11th SAT Test Day The statewide SAT for juniors was proctored during the school day at HHS. Test results should be available online by April 25th. Students were provided breaks and snacks throughout the morning and a pizza lunch following the test by Go On and Sources of Strength.
