Assessment Update

The following is a comparison of where we are for third-grade passage of Oaks this year versus the same point in time last year.

For this school year in **math**, **68.5%** of third graders have now either met or exceeded benchmarks. This class can gained **35.5%** points from first Oaks to second Oaks.

Last year at this time, **44%** of third graders had passed or exceeded their **math** Oaks benchmark. The class from last year gained **28% passing** or exceeding between the first Oaks and the second Oaks.

This year for **reading**, **72.6%** of our students have met or exceeded benchmarks after the second Oaks. This is a gained of **20.6%** points from the first Oaks in the fall.

Last year at this time for **reading**, **58.6%** of students had met or exceeded benchmarks. This was a gain of **12.6%** from the fall Oaks of 0809

Good job to all involved. We are maintaining a great focus.

- Our girls have made the final 8 teams in the state basketball tournament in Pendleton. Our boys basketball team had a great season losing in the first round of the state playoffs to DeLaSalle in Portland in a tough loss. Our wrestling team finished their season with a great surge to finish with a fourth place winner in Wacy Coil and a third place winner in Chance Day. It was the first time any Heppner wrestler has placed at the state competition and we put two on the podium. Our wrestling story is taking root in our community and really is a success story from beginning to end. This year our boys finished fourth place as a team at the district championships. Needless to say, our winter athletic programs had a great season. Congratulations to all of our winter coaches and student/athletes!
- I attended a workshop with the Career and Technical Education teachers at the ESD this month. They are working on proficiency in the classroom as a consortium. This is exciting to be part of and watch the Tech and Ag teachers leading the parade with this new way of delivering instruction. So much so, that when this work is finished- other districts and regions will be using them as a model to emulate.
- We hired a new 2 hour a day Assistant Cook in Kim Carlson. Please welcome her to our team and we are excited to have her on board.
- HHS got some positive press from Erin Mills and the East Oregonian about our proficiency work. It was printed in the weekend editorial on 2/27/10. Good stuff!
- A little birdie told me last week that HHS could gain the benefit of another grant that the Business Education Compact has written that they plan on farming out its gained resources to its partner schools! I will keep you posted of further developments as they occur[©].
- Second window testing is almost done with both reading and math. We will have about another week until it is finished. We are excited to see the growth and are celebrating our individual successes to date.
- Congratulations to Kelsi Putman for being elected as the Blue Mountain FFA District Reporter!
- Congratulations to the following students for their achievements in their FFA SAE projects, which will be going on to the State. Brynna Rust in Grain Production, Lane Wright in Outdoor Recreation, Garrett Gibbs in Natural Resources, Brett Harrison in Diversified Crop, Devin Robinson in Beef Placement, and Jarreid Miller in Ag Mechanics. These are awards were our students competed against the rest of the district students from 8 other schools that include Hermiston, Pendleton, and Milton-Freewater! Congratulations to our teacher, Mrs. Dickenson as well for her efforts and demonstrated success!

Irrigon Elementary School

- 1. **OAKS** Last month we did our second round of OAKS tests. We are doing well. This is the percentage of students passing or exceeding:
 - a. 4th Grade
 - i. Math 50%
 - ii. Reading 65%
 - b. 5th Grade
 - i. Math 49%
 - ii. Reading 60%

- c. 6th Grade
 - i. 55% Math
 - ii. 70% Reading

AYP this year is has 70% meeting in Reading and 69% meeting in Math. The growth is not yet included in the percentages above.

- 2. Writing Olympic Opening Ceremony- Last month we officially opened our State Writing assessment with an Olympic Ceremony. Ms. Cynthia Hodgdon and her 4th grade class sponsored and created this event for the first time here at IES. We showcased the Writer's Olympic Medals that all students will win. If they get a score of 6/5 a gold medal; a score of 4 for a silver medal; a bronze medal for a 3, and a certificate of participation for those who get a one or a two. We are having a final ceremony when we get the results back and will award students their medals. Our guest of honor was Assistant Superintendent, Mrs. Danielson.
- 3. AR Reading and IES Tri-City Hockey Award Field Trip- We took over 200 students and parents to the Tri-City American Hockey game on Valentines Day. They had a great time. Kids who met their AR goal got to get in free and ride the bus. For many, it was their first time to see a hockey game. After the game most kids went ice skating. Everything went very well. Irrigon was recognized for having the biggest group there in the Toyota Arena.

English as a Second Language Program

- 1. **Oregon Association of Latino Administrators** Lake Oswego-I attended OALA and obtained lots of good information of Oregon schools, and how they are doing with Hispanic students in the state. Oregon is near the bottom of the list of states in the U.S. in the N.A.P.E. tests. Many districts represented had large numbers of Hispanic student populations.
- 2. **Title III ESL Directors**' meeting was held in Salem. We received more information on making AYP and AMAO's. Carmen West and other state directors gave us pertinent information on the English Language Proficiency Assessment and other needs of ESL students also in Special Education.
- 3. Focused Approach Training for Morrow County's ELD Team- Portland- A team of four teachers and myself went to this training to know how to help content and regular elementary teachers teach not only their content but also <u>language development</u>. This is in accordance with the district's staff development plan to help all teachers teach our students with language savvy techniques.

Irrigon High School

Way to go IHS Wrestling Team! We had two district champions Giles Ellet (171) and Wade Aylett (189) and a second place finish with freshmen Andy Aguilera (140). Andy went on to beat the number one seed at state in the semi-finals and ended up with a second place finish losing a tough match 1-0. Wade, in his second trip to state, became our third state champion from Irrigon. In the team standings, we placed ninth out of twenty-eight teams – way to go wrestlers.

Congratulations to our beginning Paril-Pro team! On February 4th they competed in districts at Pendleton where they beat Hermiston finishing second behind Pendleton. Their second place finish qualified them to compete at the regional contest yesterday in La Grande where they took first place. They now will compete at the state level during spring break. The beginning team is comprised of Jessika Osborne, Leon Luna, Madisyn Cadek, Samantha Mills, Vanessa Shatto, and Samantha Baumgartner. Due to an athletic conflict, Marcus Shelton was only able to participate at the district level.

We are currently in the middle of our second round of statewide testing. We have set goals for each of our students and we have already helped a few more students meet the tenth grade benchmark as ninth graders. We are scheduling our testing to provide students with opportunities to stretch and move about; we've planned a short recess outside for each of our testing blocks. We are also providing snacks at the beginning of testing and peppermint candies (which have been shown to increase standardized test scores) throughout testing. In addition, we will be recognizing students who made benchmark or significant increases the coming weeks with posters celebrating their success.

Through a partnership between the Northwest Education Loan Association (NELA) and GEAR-UP, our 7th graders will be attending classes and programs designed just for them at Eastern Oregon University on Thursday. The program is designed to be high interest and get our students thinking about college from an early age. Our students have spent the last several weeks in their advisory classes preparing for the trip by learning about what colleges and universities are and how to prepare themselves academically and financially using workbooks provided by NELA. This is the second year that we have been able to provide this program, and we look forward to a continued partnership EOU.

The Knights Pride Booster Club is hosting their 4th Annual Auction dinner on March 13th. Stuffed pork chops and parmesan chicken are on the menu for the night. Tickets are on sale for \$15 and the doors open at 5:00. This is the booster clubs primary fund raiser of the year. They are also selling raffle tickets for a 47" flat screen and blue ray DVD home theater system valued at \$1495. The booster club continues to be a strong supporter of our programs.

It was a fun and entertaining evening for the entire family. Their Valentine Sale was also a first time event, and the PTO sold out. **PTO** did cancel their hopes of a Spaghetti Feed and Late Night Reading Night this month so that they could concentrate on improving carnival which is fast approaching in April. PTO will host another Movie Night instead. PTO is encouraging parent involvement and communication by recruiting representatives from each classroom.

After-School Program update: All third grade students (36) not meeting benchmark in OAKs are now receiving After-School or Friday School support, with most receiving both. All second grade students (47) not meeting grade level expectations in reading or math were invited to either After-School <u>or</u> Friday-School. After School's focus is practice (Study Island, Read Naturally) with some small group instruction, and Friday School's focus is class instruction based on strand data. Many English language learners benefit from the extra day of language practice offered at Friday School. Currently all students in the 2nd and 3rd grade who are not quite at benchmark standard in reading or math are receiving additional extended day opportunities.

ELPA Test Primary Measure for ELL Students

This month, all English Language Learners (ELLs) are taking the

English Language Proficiency Assessment (ELPA). The ELPA is the primary state measure for determining English Language Learners (ELL) students' English Language proficiency. It measures student progress in learning the English Language and is used in meeting NCLB requirement that states report annual progress (reported as Annual Measurable Achievement Objectives or AMAOs) of English Language Learners in acquiring English. Students access the ELPA site on the internet where they are tested for listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Students who achieve a level of "Advanced" on the ELPA are generally considered to be proficient and will likely exit from an English Language Development (ELD) program.
