Following the Cabinet meeting on June 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2014 in which we discussed the technology fee for the 2014-2015 school year, I have compiled information and come to a recommendation that the fee should be set at \$20.00. My recommendation comes from the information that has been collected from our surrounding school districts that was shared to formulate the current pro-rated fee, as well as, the experiences that we have had over the past 5 months with the 751 devices that have gone home on a daily basis. The purpose of the fee is to ensure repairs and replacement costs are covered for the iLearn 97 devices during the 2014-2015 school year. During the planning process we have made significant plans to ensure we educate our staff, students and families on safe and secure practices with these devices. We have also been able to purchase a very reputable case with a proven track record of protecting devices and the investment made by District 97 and its families. In addition, I am recommending a fee that takes into consideration that we want to keep any fees for families manageable, while still ensuring all stakeholders are invested. This recommendation comes in 20% below the anticipated fee that was presented back in February for a full year. We will continue to evaluate this process to identify if future cuts can be made to these fees once we have collected data from the 2014-2015 school year.

Over the first four months we have collected 97.4% of the anticipated fees and expect to do the same next year. During that similar period of time we have paid out a very small amount of money on repairs and replacements. With that being said we are also still under the one year manufacturers warranty and some of those repairs or replacements will fall under the district responsibility in the future. Under this consideration if expanded over a year, 33% of the current funds have and/or would have been paid out if we were not still covered under the one year manufacturers warranty. In addition, if extended over a year's time this would be at a rate of 2% of the devices deployed needing some level of repair or replacement.

As it is difficult to predict what the future will bring, our experience with the small sample size in respect to the future rollout of 3898 devices and research of other districts experiences have led me to this recommendation. We should be extremely proud and excited about the way our students have treated and cared for these devices, and believe we will continue to experience similar experiences. As we will be deploying 3898 iPad Minis in the fall, I envision these fees will ensure District 97 to be supported at similar or slight increases in rate of repair/replacement numbers (numbers closer to average 5% repair/replacement rates we have seen in other districts).
