  - February 8th- True North Program- 6-8th graders- work on personal vision boards and insights, looking at values and emotions and what influences themselves

- February 8th- Compass Program- 4-5th graders- how to respond to anger, embarrassment, jealousy, navigating friendships/relationships, stress relief, yoga
- March 15th- Star Program- 4 (before September 15th)- 5-year-olds- strengthening, wellness, friendship skills
- TriCity Family Services has openings for our Eating Disorder Program-Family Based Treatment (FBT), and we will be beginning to look for participants for the Wilderness Challenge Program (Boundary Waters Canoe Trip)
