prohibited as a violation of the district's acceptable		
use policy. Generative AI refers to the use of		
computer algorithms to generate original content		
that mimics human writing styles. While this		
technology can be useful for various academic and		
creative purposes, it is important to note that		
using generative AI to plagiarize someone else's		
work, including that of a computer program is		
unethical and can result in academic		
consequences, consistent with Denton ISD's
