<ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Failing to acknowledge another's original arguments or lines of thinking as well as using information and ideas without proper documentation. •Presenting information from other sources in a misleading way, even if they are properly cited. <p>Plagiarism is the act of using another person’s work, ideas, words, artistic productions, or expressions without appropriately crediting the original source. Plagiarism can be subtle, unintentional acts of neglect (such as forgetting to use quotation marks or references), and it can be blatant acts of knowingly stealing or taking credit for work that is not your own (such as copying an entire paper or parts of it or submitting someone else’s assignment). Students are responsible for understanding and avoiding plagiarism.</p> <p>Additionally, the use of generative artificial intelligence for the purpose of plagiarism is strictly prohibited as a violation of the district's acceptable use policy. Generative AI refers to the use of computer algorithms to generate original content that mimics human writing styles.
