- For the 2nd year students in the Virtual Option in grades 3, 5, 7 and 8 were at or above the district and state average in Language Arts

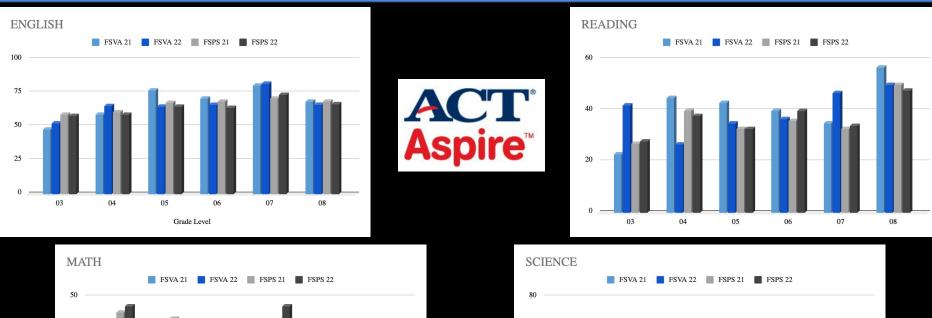

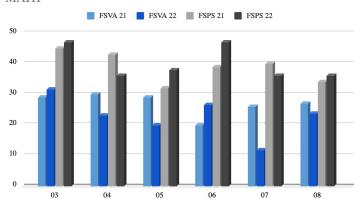
- Increased Percentage of Students on track September 2021 (45%) to April 2022 (63%)
- Decreased Percentage of Students significantly at risk September 2021 (55%) to April 2022 (37%)

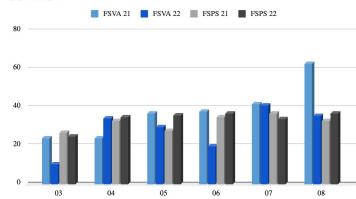
FSVA–A District Conversion Charter School:

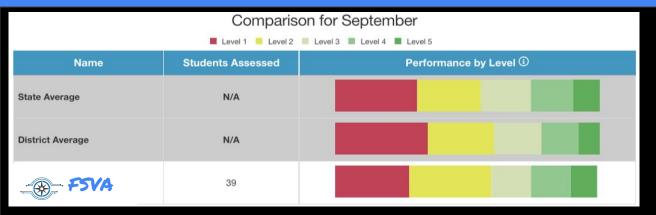

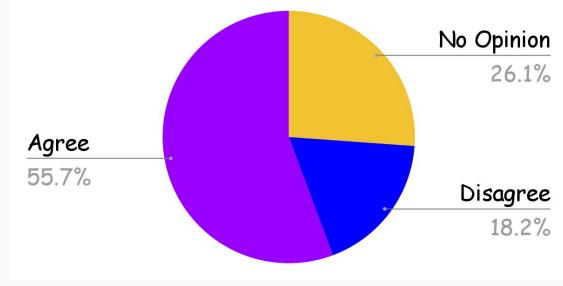
