AGENDA ITEM: Consider Approval of 2017-2018 Adult Meal Price

PRESENTER: Earl Husfeld and Patty Willhite

ALIGNS TO BOARD GOAL(S): Financial/Facilities – The District shall exhibit excellence in financial and facility planning, management, and stewardship.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

- Due to requirements implemented by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) through the Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010, school districts are required to calculate meal prices according to the Paid Lunch Equity Tool on a yearly basis.
- The meal prices calculated are established by a weighted average price formula.
- USDA also stipulates that adult meal pricing may not be supplemented by Child Nutrition Department revenues.

ADMINISTRATIVE CONSIDERATIONS:

- During the June 19th board meeting, the Board of Trustees approved adjustments to the 2017-2018 child nutrition meal prices. We shared with you during that meeting the adult meal prices may need to be adjusted at a later date because the USDA had not yet published the federal reimbursement rates.
- USDA guidance in the Administrator's Reference Manual (ARM) requires specified school districts to use an approved USDA calculation to determine prices for adult meals. Prices charged for lunch, breakfast, and snacks must be greater than the federal free reimbursement rate plus all other federal reimbursements or payments. Lunch price calculations must also add the per meal value of USDA foods.
- At the rates of reimbursements recently published by the USDA, the adult meal price for breakfast is required to be greater than \$1.71 and the adult meal price for lunch is required to be greater than \$3.64.
- No change is recommended for the adult breakfast price, currently \$2.00.
- An increase of 15 cents to \$3.75 from \$3.60 is recommended for the adult lunch price. This is the same increase as the student increase approved on June 19th.

FISCAL NOTE:

Funds generated must be used for the Child Nutrition Program.

ADMINISTRATIVE RECOMMENDATION:

The Administration recommends the Board of Trustees approve the 2017-2018 adult lunch meal price at \$3.75 as presented.

Adult Meal Calculator Worksheet

This worsheet provides the information needed to calucate adult meal prices using both approved methods. Choose the method of calculation (see the Administrator's Reference Manual, Section 15, Meal Pricing for additional information on which method to use). If the rate applies, record the rate in the Amount CE Recieves cell. If using Method 1, record the local student paid charge in the designated Local Stuent Paid Charge cell. If using Excel, this worksheet will automatically calculate the amounts in the Minimum Adult Charge and Total Federal Funds cells. All amounts are carried to 4 digits and must be rounded up when determining the adult meal price. Non-pricing programs must always use Method 2.
