TOPIC: Approval of Section 105 Schools of Choice for Franklin IB Program

RECOMMENDATION:

Move that the Board of Education of the Livonia Public Schools School District approve the acceptance of non-resident students, through the state's *Section 105 Schools of Choice* program, to attend the Franklin eleventh and twelfth grade International Baccalaureate Program under the following conditions: Students must meet the entrance criteria established for the program; up to ten students in the ninth grade, up to one student in the tenth grade, and up to ten students in the eleventh grade can enroll through *Schools of Choice* for the 2012-13 school year. In subsequent years, the number of nonresident students accepted into the program will be established such that the number of Livonia Public Schools' students and non-resident students accepted in the program is not more than 23 students per grade level. The school district administration will follow all state rules as it relates to allowing non-residents to attend this program under *Schools of Choice*.

RATIONALE:

Accepting a limited number of non-resident students will generate added revenue for the school district and allow the International Baccalaureate to be financially viable.

BUDGETARY INFORMATION:

The district would generate anywhere from \$0 to \$170,000 in additional revenue for the 2013 school year.
