Results to Date	<ol> <li>The Disaster Relief Pennies yielded an additional \$12 Million dollars in revenue for the district.</li> <li>Judson ISD received a clean audit and a Superior Rating on the 2024 FIRST (Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas). In addition, this fiscal year, property tax value audits were conducted for tax years 2019 and 2020, yielding \$2,843,548 and \$2,277,521 in revenue for the district respectively.</li> <li>Local non-payroll costs for the district last FY were reduced from \$49.6MM to \$40.8MM based on close monitoring of additional spending.</li> <li>In the previous two years, TEA notified the district that we had not met the state mandated allotment spending for certain budgets; however, our recent audit identified that spending has been met for the 2024 FY in all categories.</li> </ol>
