





























To the Honorable Members of the Michigan Legislature:

Our organizations respectfully urge you to support our "Classrooms and Kids" budget, which places a priority on directing state funds to the classrooms in Michigan's K-12 public schools.

The "Classrooms and Kids" budget is a commitment to helping all our kids compete for 21st century jobs.

Every educational leader in Michigan appreciates the hard work of the Legislature and Governor Rick Snyder in addressing the crisis brought on by legacy and retirement costs. Without the reforms made in 2011, unfunded liabilities would have significantly impaired our districts. With those reforms taking hold, now is the time to continue to support Michigan's public schoolchildren by directing resources into the classroom.

Using existing funds and without raising taxes, the "Classrooms and Kids" proposal provides more resources for children that will go directly to teaching and learning. This is where resources are most needed to avoid overcrowded classrooms and retain vital programs.

Building off the Governor's recommendation, our proposal reallocates funds from categoricals to increase the foundation grant by a total of \$250-\$291per pupil.

This proposal simplifies the budget and creates more flexibility for our schools, allowing them to meet their needs. We support this plan because it restores more local control, greatly increases the foundation allowance while addressing equity, increases at-risk funding and continues the state's commitment to paying down the MPSERS liability. Attached is a breakdown of our proposal.

Please join us in ensuring our students have the support necessary to compete for 21st century jobs by adopting the "Classrooms and Kids" budget.

Based on the analysis provided, it appears that the only categoricals that we would see eliminated would be 22f Best Practices and 99h Robotics:

22f Best practices: 2660 FTE @ \$52/ea=\$138,320

99f=\$3,000

Total reduction: \$141,320

On the flip side, the additional \$167/pupil would yield \$444,220 (again based on 2,660 students). The additional \$13/pupil equity payment would add another \$34,580 for a total increase of \$478,800.

The net effect therefore would be an increase of approximately \$337,480. It appears we would see a slight increase to at-risk funding, although there is not enough information to determine what the exact effect would be. At any rate, it would be immaterial to the budget.

Note that this is before the \$111 increase proposed by the Governor. Including that amount, the projected increase would be \$632,740!
