# POLICY ISSUE/SITUATION

On or before January 15, the Superintendent must complete and present an annual report to the community that the School District is in compliance with and is implementing as required, all of the Standards for Public Elementary and Secondary Schools as set out in OAR Chapter 581, Division 22, including all new and revised rules.

To verify compliance with the Division 22 Standards, the school district submits an Assurance Form to the Superintendent of Public Instruction signed by the District Superintendent. For any rules for which the District is not in compliance, a plan of correction must be submitted.

The required Assurance Form has changed from last year. As part of the Oregon Department of Education's mandate relief efforts, districts will report their compliance status for all Division 22 Standards every third year. In intervening years, districts will report more specific information with regards to Division 22 Standards selected by ODE leadership. For 2015-16, districts will provide information about five standards:

- a. OAR 581-022-0606 District Improvement Plan
- b. OAR 581-022-0711 Policies on Reporting Child Abuse
- c. OAR 581-022-1130 Diploma Requirements
- d. OAR 581-022-1210 District Curriculum
- e. OAR 581-022-1620 Required Instructional Time

Although districts provide information to ODE on only five of the Division 22 standards, districts are still expected to comply with all of the standards.

#### STATUS:

Staff have conducted an internal audit of the District's compliance with Division 22 requirements and have determined that the District is not in compliance with 2 of the 55 Division 22 rules (581-022-1210 District Curriculum and 581-022-1440 Human Sexuality Education). The Report to the Community and Division 22 Assurance Form are attached for Board review.

#### RECOMMENDATION:

(15-621) It is recommended that the School Board receives the report and directs the Superintendent to develop plans for remedying any area of non-compliance.
