STUDENT SUPPORT/ENRICHMENT: We had 81 students attend our student support/enrichment day on December 11<sup>th</sup>. The morning was dedicated to improving skills in reading, math, and writing. After lunch, the students were treated to Santa's Workshop and worked their way through different activities. The Caldwell Basque Club supplied all the meat, which included a turkey or ham per family plus one or two chickens, a small pork roast and a small beef roast. Boise Cascade (the old Filler-King) donated turkeys and hams left over from Thanksgiving employee gifts. Allendale Produce provided onions and oranges (maybe some potatoes). Many of our PTO moms helped us pack food boxes and several stayed late into the evening to distribute food and carry it to cars. The Homedale FFA provided gifts for two families through their "Gift of Green" and two of our elementary kids went shopping with the Homedale Police and their "Shop with a Cop" project. Three more went shopping with Silverhawk Realty and their "Christmas Angels" project. Owyhee Gardeners adopted a family, as did Lower Pleasant Ridge Grange. The Eastern Star also provided gifts and food to two families. Idaho Pizza always runs a food drive among employees and customers and then brings the food here for our food drive. There were most likely large donations made by other businesses of which we are unaware. If those donations are made to the Middle School or High School, we don't always find out.
