M-City and Upcoming Poster Fair

All of Durand Middle School's 6th graders had an exciting field trip to M-City, which is located on the University of Michigan's Ann Arbor campus. This is the facility UofM uses to test their autonomous vehicles and houses other state of the art technology.

Through a generous grant from the University of Michigan, our students were able to experience a college campus visit with STEM and safety stations. The stations included bridge building, vehicle collision safety learning and hands-on activities, drone operation, autonomous vehicle demonstrations, helmet fitting, and bike/scooter road safety with real practice in this safe and controlled environment. Our students were able to meet staff from UofM's Concussion Center, current engineering students, and staff from the University of Michigan's Mott Children's Hospital.

As a follow-up to this field trip, the staff from UofM is going to come to Durand Middle School on November 17th to give feedback and help to judge a poster competition. The students in 6th grade will be creating posters and will be able to choose one area of their learning from the field trip as the topic of their poster. Parents/guardians will also be invited to our 6th grade "Poster Fair" to view the student's work. The students will be given ribbons for participating along with prizes for the top posters!



Active Learning

Students in 7th grade science are learning about molecules using hands-on modeling. 6th grade science students are learning about the cell using creativity as they are bringing in all kinds of edible cakes and cookies along with fun toppings to represent the cell structures!



Parent Teacher Conferences and Perception Surveys

DMS is finishing up our Perception Survey window for parents, students, and staff. Each year, these subgroups fill out perception surveys. The School Improvement Team analyzes the results and shares them with the various stakeholders. We use the results to inform how we function across the school. This is one of the most powerful tools we have to get a snapshot of all the areas we are meeting our goals where we can improve for parents, students, and staff.

We held Parent Teacher Conferences on October 28th and 29th. They were a big success and went off without a hitch. Parents and guardians who attended received a copy of their child's report card and were able to visit with their child's teachers in their classrooms. The Parent Perception Survey was also set up as a station in the rotunda for parents to fill out, if they had not already done so through the link emailed home. Our school social worker, Kelly Allen, provided helpful information for parents regarding many mental health and behavioral topics. This year, we provided a Parent Teacher Conference feedback survey to our Parent Advisory Committee to see if there were any areas to adjust for next year that would improve the experience for parents/guardians.
