

- Primaries matter- especially in Texas!
- The results of 90% of Texas elections are determined in the primaries.
- If 100% of educators vote, we can change the outcome of the elections!

Show Politicians that Educators are a Strong Force at the Polls!

- Every vote counts! In 2010, Rep. Donna Howard (D-Austin) won the election by only 4 votes out of about 52,000 cast.
- In the 2014 Gubernatorial elections, only 10% of eligible voters voted in the primary, and about 5% voted in the runoff elections. There are more educators in Texas than the number of people who voted in the Republican primary runoff.
- Let's move Texas out of last place in voter turnout and elect pro-public education candidates.



Last day to register: Oct. 9, 2018
Early voting: Oct. 22–Nov. 2, 2018
Tuesday, Nov. 6, 2018: 7am–7pm

Educator's Oath to Vote

I am a Texas educator and I commit to vote in the March primary and the November general elections.

I will vote in support of public education in the interest of the more than 5 million Texas school children.

Register to Vote

You are eligible to register if:

- ✓ You are a United States citizen;
- You are a resident of the county where you submit the application;
- ✓ You are at least 18 years old on Election Day;
- You are not a convicted felon (you may be eligible to vote if you have completed your sentence, probation, and parole); and
- You have not been declared by a court exercising probate jurisdiction to be either totally mentally incapacitated or partially mentally incapacitated without the right to vote.

You can't vote if you're not registered!
