Youth Enrichment/Recreation:

- Youth Dance (prek-6th): 69 participants. They will perform on April 27th at 10 and 11 A.M. Tickets go on sale Monday, April 22.
- Youth wrestling wrapped up the beginning of April.
- 10U and 12U Traveling ball programs/practices will begin in May.

Adult Recreation:

- We were open on March 15 for the Kindergarten Registration day (Kindergartners did not have school). We had 7 sign up for the all day care.

- We will be open for the early out on April 18th (due to P/T Conferences) but will be closed on April 19 and 22nd (no school days).

Early Childhood Screening: We held our spring EC Screening on Friday, April 5th. We had 24 students participate in the screening. Last year, we had 9 participate in the EC Screening compared to this year at 24. We hold two screenings per year, and the amount to be screened are determined by the students' date of birth.
