Background & History

2022

- District partners with GreenLink Education to develop sustainability plan in 2022
- District wins Energy Champions Prize
- District issues RFP to develop 11 solar sites

2023

- District wins Clean School Bus, BTAC, grants
- District applies for first ever low income bonus credit for solar projects
- Design begins for solar projects

2024

- District wins Efficient and Healthy Schools Program Award
- Student wins Student Climate Leadership Action grant
- District wins Michigan bus funding, PSC grants, low income bonus credits
- District recommissions existing Eastern HS geothermal (30% lower gas use, \$11K/annual savings)

2025

- District nominated by MDE for Green Ribbon Schools award
- 2 schools receive Michigan Green Schools award
- District wins additional \$4.3M Michigan bus funding grant

EV Bus Project Update

- 20 electric school buses coming to Lansing School District over the next 2.5 years
- 7 buses already ordered, arriving September/October 2025
- Charger, software & maintenance RFP released May 2025
 - 13 respondents
 - 6 interviewed
 - 2 finalists re-interviewed
 - 1 vendor identified

• Funding:

- Additional \$4.3M in Michigan funding awarded June 2025
- Clean School Bus (federal) funding is flowing without obstacles
- \$16M project is fully funded with federal and state funds
- One exception: \$240K cost of additional transformers not covered by grants







Next Steps

- **Today:** Charger purchase contract recommended for approval
- **Today:** Authorization to purchase next set of 7 EV buses recommended for approval
- Charger software, maintenance contract (under board approval threshold)

This summer:

- Upgrades at Dean bus depot
- Procurement for further electrical upgrades and charger installation at Lansing Tech
- Installation of first set of chargers

October:

• First set of 7 EV buses start running
