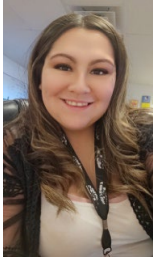
HI-SET/ Adult Basic Education/Kinship~

Grandparents Raising Grandkids/Kinship (a program within äisspoömmoötsiiyö·p) Kinship Program & Aging Mastery Program-

We've identified some subtle changes to our GRG/Kinship families but, we still have over 224 (so far) GRG/Kinship who are interested in receiving support or who are already receiving support through our McKinney Vento Program. Many of our GRG/Kinship families also meet the criteria for both. Families are eligible for MV support by meeting one of the following criteria:

- In a homeless shelter
- In a hotel or motel
- In a campground, RV, or building that is not a home

- Doubled up with friends or relatives because you cannot find or afford housing

Many of our Grandparents are requesting support with petitioning for custody through the Tribal Court System so, we are currently working to direct them in the right direction and assisting with gathering their required documentation.

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McKinney Vento Data update 2023-2024: 207

We identified #224 students experiencing homelessness for the academic year 2022-2023.

McKinney Vento (MV)

Tamara Guardipee is our districts new McKinney Vento Liaison. She is currently working to meet with all of our McKinney Vento students throughout the district and familiarize herself with each building. We have contacted all of our MV families have made sure their student has warm winter gear. We are still working to update our data with new information weekly and prioritizing documentation and collaboration with other building staff.

We are continuing to reach out to families via, phone and/or home visits while providing support to those who are requesting specific supports.

Our main goals with our McKinney Vento students are to ensure they each have access to transportation to school and they have their basic needs met to be able to focus while at school.

Tam has been providing transportation to students who are currently unable to ride the bus due to behavior issues. She will also be a part of the solution team meetings when available.

Foster Care:

This SY, we've identified over 28 students who are currently transitioning through or who have been a part of the Foster Care System. Many of which are not receiving support through the state foster care system. The types of supports that are usually requested are all related to financial support.

We were able to meet with Mr. Mclean at the Nurturing Center and will continue to provide support to the students residing there.

Teen Parents:

Currently, we've identified 10 Pregnant/Parenting Teen Parents and are continuing to meet with the Blackfeet Man Power Teen Parent Coalition as well as receive/request referrals from I.H.S.

We also have the baby pantry stocked with diapers, wipes, clothing, shoes, wraps, and hygiene items. We also have a crib, high-chair, seating supports, and a walker. With the cold spell we've been experiencing, students have had added barriers such as, frozen water pipes and traveling out in the cold with their small children. Yet, they are doing their best with attending school.

School-based Clothing Closets

Our clothing closets are always a "work-in-progress". We are currently only accepting the following sizes:

Youth: 6T, 7T, 8,9,10/12, 12/14, and 14/16

Shoe sizes: 12,1,2,3,4, and 5

If donating underwear or socks, they need to be in packaging (new).

BPS YHDP

Currently, 18 enrolled UHY.

23 UHY have been identified this 23/24 SY. Three of those students have declined support.

We are currently without a YHDP Case Manager and will be advertising this position soon. I will be providing support to these students and working extensively with our Seniors to ensure they're prepared for graduation and beyond.

UPCOMING Outreach Events for March-April:

- **Prom Readiness:** Prom is on April 6th and the Parent Community Outreach Program will be displaying our current inventory of Prom Attire for any students interested. We are also planning for our yearly Prom Support event where we offer hair styling services, make-up application, and prom accessories.

- **Reach Higher MT: Scholarship Support**
Michelle Crazy will be making multiple appearances from February 14th-May 1st. Including during Parent Teacher Conferences to assist any students or families with applying for scholarships and will provide job readiness information.

Donations Received:

This month we received 13 new prom dresses which we will have displayed for any student who may need.
