Issue Summary:

The proposed CTE courses are either already approved courses in which the objectives and courses materials are being updated or the courses are new courses that we are adding to our CTE program based on stakeholder input and North Slope/AK job forecasts. The proposed courses Include:

- Inupiaq learning Framework understandings
- Industry/Career Standards
- Alaska State Standards
- Alaska Cultural Standards

Background:

This is the CTE review year. The following CTE courses were updated: Carpentry, Intro to Business, Intro to Construction Trades 1 & 2 (originally intro was one semester), Intro to Business, Accounting, Small Business Enterprises, Personal Finance. The newly developed courses include: Boiler Maintenance, Culinary Arts Series, Arctic Home Economics, K3-8th Music performance and production, Welding, Textiles. These courses align with NSBSD strategic plan goals that include following industry standards, certification requirements and dual credit opportunities. Courses are reviewed by the Carl Perkins Committee and sub-committees which provide guidance in course development.
