Dear NKN Middle School Families,

Fall is here, and with fall comes conferences. At the middle school, we are proud to offer Student Led Conferences for our students and families. Student Led Conferences (SLCs) are different from traditional conferences in that they place students at the helm of teacher-supported discussions with parents about student progress and learning. SLCs also present opportunities for students to prepare, reflect on, and discuss evidence of their learning and growth by way of student portfolios.

Our fall conferences will be held on October 20 - 21. On October 20, teachers are working from 8:00 am - 8:00 pm to accommodate working families schedules. On October 21, teachers are working from 8:00 am - 12:00 pm. The purpose of the fall conference is for students to set goals for the year. All students will have an academic and personal goal to share with families during the conference. In April, students will be sharing their portfolio of learning with families.

This year, we have worked hard on creating a schedule for students and families to meet with their advisory teacher, and also have open times after each scheduled conferences for families to talk to core content teachers. Directly following your scheduled conference, time is set aside for all teachers to be open for walk in conversations.

Our goal is to have 95% of our families attend these conferences. Our hope is to have families meet in person, however we understand that everyone is busy. Therefore, if a Zoom conference fits your needs better, we are happy to accommodate. ATTENDANCE MATTERS!

Dear Parents/Guardians,

The Neah-Kah-Nie School District believes regular school attendance is essential for a student's success in school. Attendance is an area we focus on in order to improve student achievement and ensure all students at Neah-Kah-Nie Schools have the opportunity to maximize their potential.

The district has a new attendance protocol with a dedicated team at each school to:

- Assist families and students in improving student attendance.
- Reduce chronic absenteeism.
- Multi-tiered Attendance Team: Parents, Teachers, Secretary, Principal, Family Resource Coordinator (FRC), Counselor, ESL & Special Education staff.

We encourage families to help your child build the habit of good Attendance

- · Talk about the importance of showing up to school every day.
- · Help your children maintain daily routines, such as finishing homework and getting a good night's sleep.
- . Try to schedule medical appointments and extended trips when school isn't in session
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counselors and other parents for advice on how
 to make your child feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- Seek help from school staff and other parents or community agencies, if you need support.

Cell Phone Use At School

Cell phones can be brought to school, but must remain in students' backpacks at all times during the school day. The phones should be on silent mode to ensure they do not disrupt the classroom instruction.

If a student is found with a phone during school hours:

- The first time, the phone is brought to the office. The student can pick it up at the end of the day.
- The second time, the phone will remain in the office until a parent picks it up.
- The third time, the phone remains in the office until further notice.

We have gone over this rule several times with students, but it would be great if you shared this with your student too. We have found middle school students need to hear things several times before it gets stuck in their head!

Student ID Numbers

Your student ID is also the password on your chromebooks. It's also the same number that you enter in the cafeteria when you get a hot lunch. Students please remember to enter it in when you go through the lunch line!

From Our Nurse's Office

We are seeing lots of viral infections as we enter fall. Remember the basics as we enter fall and winter—wash hands frequently, get plenty of sleep, drink water and eat a balanced diet. Please remember students who have a fever, vomiting, diarrhea or uncontrolled cough need to stay home from school. Also, COVID guidelines still apply. If positive for COVID, students are out of school 5 days and can return on day 6 as long as feeling well enough to be at school, cough is well controlled and fever free 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications. Students would mask in public on days 6-10 if positive for COVID.

Call the office if your students are sick or if you have questions about when they can return to school.

Immunizations

Now is a good time to make sure your students are up-to-date with required vaccinations prior
to resuming any hybrid or in person learning. Exclusion day is February 16, 2022. Any student
that is not current with their immunizations will be sent home. Requirements from the Oregon

From the Counselor

Dear Families,

We are so grateful you are a part of the school community this year.

One of the aims of our school is to equip young people for all the realities of today's world. With that in mind, we have partnered with CharacterStrong – an organization that provides training for educators and curricula for students. Their work in grades 6-12 focuses on 3 main outcomes: increasing a sense of belonging for all students, improving skills that support student well-being, and deepening student engagement in their academics, in their school, and in their community. Here's what the data tells us:

• A sense of belonging in school is one of the most important conditions for learning and a fundamental support for social and emotional well-being. Nearly 1/3 of all students report a

weak sense of belonging in their schools. Roughly half of 6th – 12th grade students say they don't enjoy coming to school most of the time.

- Mental health challenges for teens have been increasing and 7 out of 10 teens in the U.S. (between 13 and 17 years old) have named anxiety or depression as a major problem among their peers.
- Student engagement drives learning and supports school success.

This curriculum was created to support school communities as they engage in the work of preparing young people to thrive in the 21st century. The research supports the effectiveness of this content to increase students' academic success and college & career readiness. The lessons focus on developing skills and mindsets around building positive habits, understanding our emotions, improving teamwork, and increasing empathy.

One of the key parts of nearly every lesson is the "CharacterDare" for Middle School students. These are invitations near the end of most lessons to put the content that they are learning into action in the real world. If you ever want to play an active role in the CharacterStrong curricula, simply ask your student about the most recent CharacterDare. Maybe they'll invite you to try one yourself!
