 - a. Alak SAC finalized the Community School Expectations Agreement this spring. The process involved gathering input from the SAC, community members, staff and students.

- b. Many activities are occurring and have occurred at Alak School since our last report. We just finished the basketball season and are beginning NYO. Our robotics team had a strong season, and though the competition is over, they continue to meet every other Saturday to enhance their skills. Our student council has launched a recycling program and just sponsored a very successful carnival for the community.
- c. Students continue to enjoy traveling for academic purposes. Several eighth-grade students just returned from a trip to Utqiagvik where they learned about hydroponics. They brought back a unit that will be installed in the science classroom. We are also sending more students to Alaska Excel; this program has been very popular with our students.
- 6. Social/Emotional Promoting positive school climate
 - a. Our PBIS team has been meeting regularly at the building level as well as with the state team. Teachers are implementing husky tickets when students are demonstrating our school's targeted behaviors: cooperation, responsibility and respect.
 - b. The SAC just sponsored a pizza party to recognize honor roll and perfect attendance students.
 - c. The SAC is sponsoring a site-based prom on Saturday March 23 for students in grades 7-12.
 - d. We've enjoyed daily support from local culture bearers that are helping students with sewing projects as well as drumming and singing. It's wonderful to these community members in the school working with students.
- 7. Strategic Plan Goals/Pedagogy Implementation
 - a. We plan to continue collaborating with our community to identify priorities and needs for our school and students. We understand that family engagement is important. We are working closely with our administration to ensure that school events are being broadcasted in a timely manner to increase community and parental involvement.
