Morrow County School District is pleased to report that our students outperformed the state and comparison districts data on 5 of 6 outcome performance measures as it relates to what students are achieving in High School. Compared to districts with similar demographics, such as poverty levels, diversity of their student body, and pupil mobility, MCSD Seniors outperformed their counterparts in college and career readiness (as measured by freshman on track to graduate and the percentage of students who took the SAT), high school graduation rate, completion rate, and continuing education.

The state also requires each district to reach above 95% student participation as one way to help ensure schools are meeting the needs of all students in all groups. Morrow County School District met or exceeded this standard as well.

The U. S. Department of Education has given the State of Oregon approval to temporarily suspend the assignment of school ratings during the transition from the Oregon Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (OAKS) to the new college and career readiness assessments. MCSD Schools will not receive an overall school rating on this report card, and will receive a new overall school rating on the 2015–16 school report cards.

Included in the report card are school, state, and like district results from the Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium (SBAC) assessments taken electronically this spring by students in grades 3-8, 10 and 11. The exams were in English Language Arts (reading, writing and listening) and mathematics. This is the first full year of implementing the SBAC and Morrow County School District has made plans to utilize the results from this year's assessment to improve student learning in the future.

"Although Morrow County schools compares similar to our like district counter parts in all assessed areas of SBAC, It's important that we don't use this as a tool to compare these results to former OAKS results. The SBAC test measures college and career readiness, these standards are more rigorous and harder to demonstrate mastery" according to Superintendent Dirksen. "We will continue to use SBAC data to provide insight into what our students know and are able to do. However, we will keep in mind that the SBAC is only one measure of overall success for our students. Our goal is ensuring students are learning how to become better readers, thinkers, and problem solvers; our ultimate goal is 100% graduation" stated Superintendent Dirksen.
