

How to Get Your Child Vaccinated for COVID-19

Be Ready, Minnesota. Kids Deserve A Shot.

Children ages 5-11 are eligible to receive the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine for 5-11-year olds.



3 Ways to Get Your Child Vaccinated

- Visit mn.gov/vaxforkids to find and contact providers or pharmacles near you, including:
 - Pediatric and family medicine clinics, primary care providers, federally qualified health centers, local public health agencies, tribal health agencies, state community sites and clinics, and Indian Health Service locations.
- 2. Check with your pediatrician or family medicine clinic about appointments.
- Watch for vaccination clinics being offered at schools or other community locations around Minnesota.

THE FACTS

- The vaccine is safe for children ages 5-11.
- The vaccine protects children and families from COVID-19:
- The vaccine is free.

Children ages 5-11 who complete a COVID vaccine series in January or February are eligible to receive a \$200 Visa gift card and enter a drawing for five \$100,000 college scholarships.
