1. What's new at CIHS?

- i. The 2016-17 High School Handbook / Calendar was printed and will be mailed to all C-I students/parents. You will also receive a copy at tonight's meeting.
- ii. "New Teacher Induction Days" took place on August 8-10. I'm very excited to have this time before workshop days and school starting to better prepare the new teachers in our district.
- iii. C-I "College in the Schools" (CIS) instructors attended a workshop at Central Lakes College (CLC) on Thursday, August 18 to work with their cooperating instructors from CLC and to learn about updates and other new information regarding CIS.
- iv. First day of workshops for all staff is August 30, and the teachers will also be here on Wednesday, August 31, and Thursday, September 1, for workshop days.
